

A NEW STORY: HOW INDWELL DEVELOPS AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Simcoe, a community of almost 15,000 located halfway between Brantford and Lake Erie, will have its first Indwell program this fall. It has been remarkable to see how God has paved the way for our new program to begin. Two years ago, community members and civic leaders, aware of the desperate need for affordable housing in Haldimand and Norfolk counties, visited Indwell's Perkins Centre in Hamilton. They met tenants, talked with staff, and became convinced that something similar could be developed in Simcoe.

Architects and engineers visited St. James United Church's former Sunday School and ministry building, Hambleton Hall, which was up for sale. They determined that the large building could be transformed into apartments. In addition to an ongoing support agreement, the county leveraged \$2 million of federal and provincial Investment in Affordable Housing funds towards the \$5.3-million project. That support cleared the way to purchase the property. By April 2015, extensive renovations began.

This is the first time in 12 years that Indwell is moving to a new city, and we couldn't be more excited. But Simcoe is just one of many communities interested in finding solutions to homelessness. Almost daily, churches and other organizations call to inquire about our model of housing with supports.

The need is overwhelming: over 80 people have already applied for the 35 permanent apartment units that will open this fall. The need is similar in communities across Ontario.

Typically, Indwell applies for funding for a portion of a new project. The remainder, often still more than 50% of total costs, we need to finance and fundraise. For that, we rely on our supporting community. Partner with Indwell by contacting us at indwell.ca/donate or call 1866 529 0454.


