

About Hambleton Hall

Hambleton Hall, built in 1957, served Simcoe, and Norfolk and Haldimand Counties, as a hub for church and community groups, theatre productions, banquet hall, and food pantry among other things. Continuing in this serving legacy, Hambleton Hall is being repurposed into affordable housing, with some spaces available to the wider community. By the end of 2016, this will be home to 40 tenants. Skilled staff and caring volunteers will work with tenants to maximize their ability to maintain their own homes and strengthen their supports. Each unit is efficiently designed to be easily managed by people with disabilities. Plentiful natural light and finishing details CORR 125 enhance health and wellness.

Building Details

- 23 unfurnished one-bedroom apartments (8 accessible)
- 17 furnished studio apartments (1 accessible)
- Laundry, computer lab
- Multi-use room available for community events
- Outdoor covered bicycle & scooter parking
- Community garden & gazebo
- Elevator



Why Simcoe?

There are 200 people in Haldimand-Norfolk, many with disabilities, like mental illness, who are without a place they can call home. This does not include those that have moved away to find the supported housing they need. The local community identified quality affordable housing with supports as a key part of the solution. Church leaders, municipal staff and politicians visited Indwell's Perkins Centre in Hamilton and the vision for Hambleton Hall was born.

Finances

The Hambleton Hall redevelopment is an approximately \$4.6 million project. The three levels of government (federal, provincial and municipal) are contributing \$2.0 million to the capital costs and Indwell will obtain a mortgage for the balance. Capital donations received from the community will reduce the size of the mortgage.

Ongoing operation costs will be covered by:

- Tenant rent (because rent is deeply affordable, this does not cover all operating costs);
- Operating funding agreement with Norfolk County;
- Partnership with Norfolk County and Salvation Army for five emergency units and,
- Strong ongoing donation and volunteer support from area churches, community organizations and individuals to augment supports offered at Hambleton Hall (which supports the charity and continues Indwell's growth).
